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## 1. Course Catalog

NPM 307 Psychiatric - Mental Health Nursing

(1-0-3=3)

This course introduces the basic principles and concepts of mental health nursing. Emphasis will be on therapeutic interventions and nursing care for individuals and also who are taking care of their family set up. This also includes rehabilitative aspects of the patients with mental illness.

#### 2. Scope and Course Objectives

#### 2.1 General:

Students will be able to acquire knowledge regarding mental health and illness and its nursing management so that the students will be able to develop skills in rendering care to the psychiatric patients.

### 2.2. Knowledge:

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to:

- 1. Explain psychiatric-mental health nursing and mental disorders.
- Describe various nursing models and the nursing process to plan and implement nursing care in various healthcare settings for patients who demonstrate symptoms related to ineffective coping patterns, anxiety, mood disorders, psychotic disorders and crisis.
- 3. Describe socio-cultural considerations significant to mental health treatment.
- 4. Identify the legal issues associated with psychiatric nursing.
- 5. Recognize different roles of a psychiatric nurse.
- 6. Plan nursing interventions to support patients experiencing emotional responses to medical illness.
- 7. Construct a teaching plan to promote mental health and the safe use of psychiatric medications.

#### 2.3. Skills:

- 1. Establish and maintain a therapeutic nurse-client relationship with a patient experiencing psychiatric symptoms.
- 2. Assess patient's mental health by utilizing interview and observation skills and performing a complete mental status examination.
- 3. Evaluate patient responses to psychotropic medications including effectiveness, side effects and compliance.
- 4. Develop, implement and evaluate nursing care to effectively support client experiencing psychiatric symptoms.
